JR. HIGH AWARDS CRITERIA

At Father Michael Mireau School, we believe in recognizing the achievements, successes and progress of our students. We celebrate these achievements by hosting a year end Junior High Awards Night in order to publicly recognize and celebrate student successes in various pursuits. The awards are based on specific criteria that highlight the students' achievement, success and progress over the course of the school year.

Below are the categories for the awards & the corresponding criteria for students to be eligible for recognition.

HONORS

The “**Honors Award**” is presented to the students who have achieved an average grade of 80% across the 4 core subjects of Language Arts, Math, Social Studies & Science, with no grade below 75% or Proficient.

The “**Honors With Distinction Award**” is presented to the students who have achieved an average grade of 90% across the 4 core subjects, with no grade below 85% or Proficient.



HIGHEST CORE SUBJECT

The “**Highest Core Subject Award**” is presented to one student in each of the core subject areas, including Religion. One student per grade level who has achieved the highest overall academic average will be recognized.





HIGHEST OVERALL ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The “Highest Overall Academic Achievement Award” is presented to the student in each grade level that has achieved the highest overall average in the 4 core subjects of Language Arts, Math, Social Studies & Science.



COMPLEMENTARY COURSES

The “Complementary Courses Awards” are presented to the students in each complementary course per grade level who has demonstrated exceptional proficiency and skill in that particular discipline.



GOD IS LOVE

The “God is Love Award” is presented to a student from each Homeroom for being a positive role model that lives according to Father Catfish’s example of “serving like a superhero”. These students are recognized for putting in effort into their studies, students who try hard, students who volunteer on their own to help others, etc. They are considered on the significance of their actions and not primarily on academic standards. They are students who choose to do the right thing and not give in to peer pressure. These students stand out as great role models for their peers.



OUTSTANDING GROWTH

The “Outstanding Growth Award” is presented to a Grade 7, 8 and 9 student who has demonstrated great improvement throughout the school year. These students have overcome obstacles and shown remarkable improvement in grades, effort, contributions and attitude.

ATHLETICS

The “Heart & Hustle Award” is presented to an athlete from each of the Junior and Senior teams who demonstrated passion, grit and a strong work ethic. These players were always eager to learn and develop their game through hard work, perseverance and a positive attitude. These student-athletes have consistently gone above and beyond throughout the season, and have always put their team first.

The “Most Valuable Player Award” is presented to an athlete from each of the Junior and Senior teams who has demonstrated leadership, dedication and athletic excellence in their respective sport. These student-athletes were key assets to their team’s success, both on and off the playing field. The MVP award is presented to the players with the best all-around performance in the season.

The “Male & Female Athlete of the Year Award” is presented to a male & female student who have demonstrated dedication, leadership and athletic excellence in a variety of school sports. This award recognizes students who have played on at least two Senior teams throughout the school year. These skilled athletes have proven to represent our school in an outstanding manner, both on and off the playing field.
